

# Annual Report of the school events - (2025-2026)



## April-2025

The Academic Year 2025-2026 began with an orientation programme on 29th March 2025 for the parents of Class IV students was held in the Seminar Hall, which proved informative and helpful. On 01 April 2025, a staff meeting was conducted to prepare for the new academic session, led by Sr. Grace, the then Principal, who discussed the goals and plans for the year. On the same day, Sr. Dhanya and Ms. Shifa Khan attended a Peace Club Seminar at Maria Vidhya Sadan School, Bareilly, where Fr. Kiran from Sagar delivered an inspiring session.

The school also organized engaging activities for students. The primary section celebrated a summer-themed bagless day 'Sun Fun Fiesta' with a colourful fancy dress competition. On 15 April 2025, the school underwent an official inspection by DPC officials- Ms. Aishwarya Mundda and Ms. Monika Patel. The Eco Club celebrated Earth Day on 22 April, promoting environmental awareness. On 24 April, students enjoyed creative activities during another bagless day, and certificates and medals were awarded to winners of Olympiad exams such as NSO, IGKO, UIEO, IMO, and Puzzle Olympiad. The session concluded on 29 April 2025, when students received their summer assignments before the holidays.

## June 2025

In June 2025, the school gradually resumed its activities after the summer vacation. Teachers in charge returned on 2 June 2025 for Class XI counselling and subject selection, followed by full-time teachers on 9 June and the remaining staff on 12 June, marking the phased reopening. On the same day, an in-house seminar on the National Curriculum Framework (NCF) 2022 & 2023 was conducted by Mr. Edmond Dantise to enhance teachers' understanding of curriculum and teaching strategies. On 18 June, another seminar on maintaining teacher diaries and preparing effective lesson plans was held, where Ms. Richa Maheshwari shared valuable insights. A worker staff picnic was also organized to Fun City Park, Bhopal on 19 June, making it a joyful occasion for the support staff.



The school principal conducted a meeting on 20 June to discuss important guidelines for the new academic session. On 21 June, the school celebrated International Yoga Day with yoga asanas and meditation guided by the sports teachers, promoting physical and mental well-being. The school officially reopened for Classes I to XII on 23 June with a special assembly conducted by the teachers. On 24 June, the school celebrated Sr.Celine's birthday with warmth and appreciation. The month concluded with a Cyber Security Awareness session on 28 June, conducted by Mr. Ambuj Maheshwari for students of Classes X-XII, educating them about safe online practices, cyberbullying, and social media privacy.

## July 2025

July 2025 was a significant month marked by important events and celebrations in the school. On 1 July 2025, a farewell ceremony was organized in honour of the esteemed Principal, Sr. Grace, recognizing her dedicated service, and the newly appointed Principal, Sr. Helen, was formally welcomed. The school conducted the Cabinet election process on 4 July, and the results were announced on 5 July, congratulating the newly elected leaders and encouraging them to serve with sincerity and responsibility. On the same day, a farewell celebration for Sr. Grace was also held at Raviraj Resort, attended by the entire staff, creating many joyful memories. Guru Purnima was celebrated on 10 July through a special assembly presented by the students of Classes VI A and VI B.



The school organized the Investiture Ceremony on 12 July, along with the opening ceremony of the Golden Jubilee Celebrations, where the newly elected cabinet members were awarded badges and took the oath of responsibility. A 'Nasha Mukti Awareness Program' was conducted on 16 July to educate students about the harmful effects of substance abuse. A staff meeting was held on 17 July under the guidance of the new Principal, Sr. Helen, to discuss

important academic and disciplinary matters. Periodic Test-I for Classes VI to XII was conducted from 19 July to 26 July 2025. On 26 July, the school observed 'Kargil Vijay Diwas' along with a 'Vriksharopan Abhiyan' to honour the bravery of Indian soldiers and promote environmental awareness. On the same day, a Leadership Training Program was also organized for cabinet members to strengthen their leadership skills, teamwork, and discipline. ## August 2025

The month of August 2025 was marked by a variety of academic, cultural, and co-curricular activities in the School. Students actively participated in several inter-school events, including a Quiz Competition on MP



Tourism at Excellence School, Raisen; a Debate Competition at Graphite School, Mandideep; and a Street Play Competition at Carmel Convent Senior Secondary School, BHEL, Bhopal. In all these competitions the students laurelled school with prizes. The School also hosted a Quiz Competition on MP Tourism through the YUVA Tourism Club under the guidance of Ms. Neetu Gour. Educational initiatives included a seminar on 'My Body-My Safety' conducted by the School Counsellor, Ms. Ruth Chenthitta Philip, and a seminar organized by the Eco & Science Club for students of Classes VI-VIII. Various activities were organized to celebrate Independence Day and Raksha Bandhan, including competitions for junior classes, an art competition on the theme of patriotism, and a special assembly presented by Classes VIIA and VII B on 'Independence Then & Now.'



Students also brought laurels to the School through their participation in district and divisional level competitions such as chess, badminton, football, and taekwondo tournaments. The School community celebrated important occasions including Janmashtami, Raksha Bandhan, and National Sports Day, the latter marked by a mini marathon in Raisen with the participation of 200 students. Social responsibility was promoted through a cultural

programme organized at the District Jail by the SUNI Family Social Activity Club. Other notable events included a Mini Alumni Meet, orientation programmes for parents and teachers, participation in the Student Cabinet Conclave 2025-2026 organized by the Archdiocese of Bhopal, and a staff meeting to discuss academic assessments. These activities reflected the School's commitment to holistic education and active student engagement.

### September 2025

The month of September 2025 was filled with numerous academic, cultural, and sports activities that reflected the enthusiasm and active participation of students. On 1 September, Students - Anant Raghuwanshi of Class XII and Daksh Namdev of Class X represented the School at the Division Level Badminton Tournament in Vidisha, displaying commendable skills and sportsmanship. The School also organized various competitions for Classes VI-XII in anticipation of Teacher's Day. Class IX conducted a special assembly on the theme 'Our School, Our Pride,' while a Talent Show Competition for Classes III-V highlighted the diverse talents of young students. The School celebrated Teacher's Day with a memorable programme organized by the students to honour their teachers. Students also participated in several external events, including an Inter-School Painting Competition at Carmel Convent School, Bhopal on the theme 'Swachhta HI



Sewa Hai,' athletics competitions, and cricket selection trials at Raisen Stadium, where 14 students were later selected for the Division Level Cricket Competition.

Students continued to achieve success in various sporting events, including participation in the State Level Taekwondo Competition held in Gwalior and Chhindwara, where four students qualified for the National Level Championship. Educational exposure was enhanced through activities such as a Nature Walk to Raisen Fort organized by the Yuva Tourism Club and a visit by Class XI students to the Mahila Police Thana, Raisen, to learn about the role of the police in protecting women and children. The School also observed 'World Suicide Prevention Day' through a week of activities promoting mental health awareness, resilience, and support-seeking among students. Academic assessments were conducted through the Term I Examination for Classes I-VIII and Periodic Tests for Classes IX-XII. The School community also celebrated the birthday of the Principal, Rev. Sr.Helen, with warmth and gratitude. Additionally, the District Child Welfare Committee, Raisen, organized a seminar for teachers on the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, enhancing awareness about child protection and safety.



## October 2025



The month of October 2025 began with the School reopening on 4 October after the Dussehra and 'Urs' holidays in Raisen. The school family began the preparations of Golden jubilee celebrations of its establishment. The festive spirit continued with a Dussehra Special Assembly conducted by students of Classes VII C, VII D, and VII E. As part of 'Poshan Maah', the Health & Wellness Club organized a special assembly and Nutrition Day, encouraging students to bring healthy food in their lunch boxes and promoting awareness about proper nutrition. The School also celebrated St. Francis Day with a special assembly presented by Class XI in honour of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of the school which was followed by a cake-cutting ceremony celebrating the birthday of the Vice Principal, Sr. Stephy. A Parent-Teacher Meeting was held for Nursery to Class XII, where Term I and PT-2 results were reviewed and parents discussed their children's progress with teachers. Additionally, the Exam results of Classes IV-X provided

students with an opportunity to evaluate their knowledge and skills.

Festive and educational activities continued with a Diwali Special Assembly conducted by Classes VIII A and VIII B, featuring a dramatization that highlighted the importance of celebrating an eco-friendly Green Diwali. A seminar on 'Gender Equality and Cyber Safety' was also organized to raise awareness among students about child safety, rights, and responsible digital behaviour. The School

remained closed from 18 to 23 October for the Diwali holidays and reopened on 24 October. Later in the month, Rev. Fr. James M. L. and Rev. Fr. Nitin visited the School to review the preparations for the upcoming Annual Function. The month concluded with students of Classes IX A and IX B participating in the 'Run for Unity', running from Police Line Colony to the Stadium to promote unity, fitness, and national integration.

## November 2025



The month of November 2025 was marked by several meaningful events and celebrations in the School. On 1 November, a Torch Rally for the 'Sansad Khel Mahotsav' passed through the School, where Principal Rev. Sr. Helen honoured the torch bearers and the staff warmly welcomed them, fostering a sense of pride and community spirit. On 7 November, the Police Department organized a programme commemorating 150 years of 'Vande Mataram,' which featured an online address by Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, and students from Classes VI-VIII represented the School. A major highlight of the month was the 50th Golden jubilee celebration of the School, titled 'Paras Patthar: Transforming Lives Through 50 Years,' held on 2 days, for Nursery to Class 5 on 14 November and for Classes 6 to 12 on 15 November respectively. The event marked a significant milestone and was made memorable by the presence of dignitaries, alumni, former Administrative staff, principals, staff, and students. The celebration included the recognition of the dedicated

services of the former administrative staff, teachers and support staff who have served the institution for 25 + years honouring their tireless commitment to shaping futures.

The School also organized an educational excursion to Bhopal on 21 November, where students of Class XI visited the Rashtriya Bal Vigyanik Pradarshani at Regional Institute of Education, the State Museum, and the Tribal Museum, enriching their scientific, historical, and cultural knowledge. The Intramural Sports Competition for Classes IX-XII commenced on 22 November with enthusiastic participation from all houses under the guidance of the Sports teachers. On the same day, a team of students participated in the Inter-School Skating Competition at IES Public School, Bhopal, bringing accolades to the School, while few teachers attended a Capacity Building Seminar at Sagar Public School, Bhopal to enhance teaching strategies and learning outcomes. Later in the month, students of Class XII enjoyed a one-day outing, strengthening student-teacher bonds and providing a refreshing experience. Additionally, students of Grades V and VIII appeared for the Safal Exams on 10, 12, 18, and 21 November and 1 December, which assessed their competency-based knowledge and skills across subjects.



## December 2025



The month of December 2025 was filled with academic assessments, co-curricular activities, and preparations for important events. The School conducted P.T. 2/3 examinations for Classes I to XI beginning on 1 December. Sports activities for students of Classes III-V were organized on 6 December by the Sports Teachers, where students enthusiastically participated in various games and events. On

the same day, a Career Counselling Session was conducted for students of Classes IX-XII by KIPS Publications, with Ms. Rehana as the Resource Person, guiding students in making informed decisions regarding subject selection and future career paths. The Pre-Board Examination for Class XII commenced on 12 December and concluded on 22 December. Teachers also participated in a seminar organized on 13 December by Navdeep Publication at Orchid Bliss Hotel, where Dr. Samuel Roy, a renowned CBSE accreditation member provided valuable insights on effective classroom management, addressing teaching challenges, and fostering stress-free learning environments. The morning of 15 December was too gloomy by the shocking news of the passing away of Mrs, Kunta Lodi, a support staff who completed 26 years of service in the institution.



On 16 December, the school organized another meeting with the alumni leaders and discussed regarding the upcoming Grand Alumni Meet, followed by a meeting of alumni teachers on 18 December under the leadership of the Principal, Rev. Sr. Helen, to coordinate the arrangements. The Inter-House Sports Competition for Classes VI-VIII was conducted on 18 and 19 December, with enthusiastic participation from all students. A Parent-Teacher Meeting for Classes Nursery to XI and a Parent Orientation Programme for Classes VI-VIII were held on 20 December to discuss students' progress and academic guidance. The topic of the orientation was 'Good Parenting' by a versatile psychologist Ms.Garima Dahima. The festive spirit of Christmas was celebrated through various competitions on 22 December, including a Dance Competition for Classes III-V and Class Decoration and Carol Singing Competitions for Classes VI-XII. The celebrations concluded on 23 December with a joyful Christmas celebration for teachers, featuring group performances of songs, dances, and skits, creating a warm and festive atmosphere in the School. The school's grand Alumni meet was held on 27 and 28 of December. The days witnessed cheers, laughter and memories. The school campus was reenergized once again with the presence of the past students, Principals, Vice Principals and staff.

## January 2026

The month of January 2026 began with the School gradually reopening after the winter vacation. Classes X





and XII resumed on 2 January, followed by Classes VI-XI on 5 January and Nursery to V on 8 January. The Class XII Pre-Board Practical Examinations commenced on 3 January, while the Final Practical Examinations for Class XII in Science, Commerce, and Humanities began on 7 January. A combined meeting of School Management Committee and Parents Teachers Association was held on the 3rd January, in order to discuss about the plans for the next Academic year. A demonstration session by Tata ClassEdge was conducted for the teaching staff in the seminar hall to enhance digital teaching methods. The School's Social Activity Club (SUNI Family) organized a visit to the Gandhi old-age home, Raisen encouraging students to interact with and honour senior citizens. Yoga sessions were also conducted for students of Classes VIII and IX, including activities on National Youth Day to commemorate Swami Vivekananda and promote fitness, resilience, and well-being. Parent-Teacher Meetings for Class XII Science, Commerce, and Arts streams were held to review Pre-Board examination performance, and a meeting of Class XI teachers was also conducted in the Principal's office.

The School also witnessed several meaningful and celebratory events during the month. The SUNI Family Social Activity Club organized a village visit to Naktara and conducted a Nukkad natak 'cyber security awareness' to bring awareness about safe digital practices to the

villagers. Class XII students marked the conclusion of their school journey with a heartfelt 'Thanksgiving' assembly on 20 January, a Farewell Ceremony was followed on the next day organized by Class XI celebrating the school life of the outgoing batch. In preparation for Republic Day, students of Classes III-VIII participated in Patriotic Song and Dance Competitions, and republic day celebrations and prize distribution was organized on 24 January, by Classes VIII C, D, and E, attended by the leaders of the School Alumni Association. The month also saw participation in the Peace Convention 2026 in Sagar, themed 'Peace Begins with Me,' which promoted harmony and social responsibility. The academic focus continued as the Final Examinations for Classes IX and XI commenced on 31 January, marking an important phase in the academic calendar.

The government organized an 'Adhaar card updation Abhiyan' in the school for the students under the supervision of the appointed Nodel officer Mr. Jefrin Antony.

## February 2026

The month of February 2026 focused on academic assessments and student well-being activities. On 4 February, the Class XII Final Practical Examinations concluded, and final practical exams of Class XI commenced on 7 January. Classes 9 and 11 concluded their final exams on 16 February, a Dental and Oral Health Checkup Drive was organized by the Health and Wellness Club of the school for students of Classes V and VI on the



same day. The camp was headed by Dr. Insiyah DDS and Ms. Arti Yadav, the school nurse to promote awareness about oral hygiene and healthy dental practices. The School also organized a seminar on 'Teenage/Adolescence changes' by the Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH) committee on 21 February. Ms. Ruth Philip, the school counselor raised awareness about personal safety and protection for students of Classes VI to VIII.

The academic focus continued with the Final Examinations for Classes I to VIII commencing on 25 February. On 26 February, the Final Examination Results for Classes IX and XI were declared, marking an important milestone for students as they progressed to the next stage of their academic journey. These activities reflected the School's commitment to maintaining a balance between academic excellence, health awareness, and student safety.



### March 2026

The month of March 2026 marked the transition into a new academic phase for the School. The new academic session for Classes X and XII commenced on 5 March, beginning another year of focused learning and preparation for board examinations. Meanwhile, the final examinations for Classes I to V were successfully completed on 9 March, followed by the completion of final examinations for Nursery to SKG on 12 March and Classes VI to VIII on 13 March. Teachers from various CBSE schools in Raisen district visited our school daily as it was a CBSE Class X evaluation centre.

The School also proceeded with important academic milestones as the evaluation process continued. On 18 March 2026, the results for students from Nursery to SKG were declared, on 23 March, of Classes 1 to V and on 25 March of Classes VI to VIII were declared, marking the conclusion of the academic year for the entire school. These events reflected the School's continued commitment to maintaining a structured academic schedule and supporting students in their educational progress.
